1. Purpose and Vision

3. Eligibility Requirements

To receive the scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

General Criteria

- Be enrolled or accepted in an accredited undergraduate, master's, or doctoral program.
- Demonstrate a commitment to community development, social change, business, or politics.
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (undergraduate) or 3.5 (graduate and doctoral levels).

- Submit an essay or research proposal outlining their vision for economic or political change in underserved communities.
- Provide at least two recommendation letters from professors, community leaders, or employers.
- Participate in a B'nai Binah leadership training program or a community service project aligned with B'nai Binah's mission.

Research Grant Requirements

- Must submit a detailed research proposal on policy development, economic justice, or business growth strategies for underserved communities.
 - Must provide a breakdown of expected research costs.

Priority Groups

- Students from low-income backgrounds.
- First-generation college students.
- Individuals working on African-American and African economic empowerment.
- Students committed to public service and grassroots leadership.

4. Scholarship Funding and Budget Breakdown

To ensure the longevity of the scholarship, B'nai Binah will maintain a 10-year financial projection with a growth plan to sustain and expand the fund.

5. Funding and Sustainability Plan

To keep the scholarship growing, B'nai Binah will implement a multi-tiered fundraising strategy, including:

1. Annual Fundraising Gala & Corporate Sponsorships

- Red, Black & White Banquet: Annual event to honor scholarship recipients and attract corporate and private sponsors. Expected fundraising goal: \$1 million per year.
- Corporate Endowments: Partnering with companies, universities, and government institutions to contribute annually. Target: \$1.5 million per year.

2. Membership & Donor Contributions

- Individual Donor Tiers (Bronze \$500, Silver \$1,000, Gold \$5,000, Platinum \$10,000).
 - Projected Annual Membership Donations: \$500,000.

3. Investment & Trust Fund

- Establishing an investment portfolio, growing annually with compound interest.
- Allocating 20% of funds raised to an endowment for sustainability.
- Expected yearly growth: \$600,000 per year.

4. University Partnerships

- Creating collaborations where universities match scholarship funds for recipients.
- Targeted partnerships with U.S., Ghanaian, and African universities.
- Expected contribution: \$500,000 per year.

Total Projected Annual Fundraising: \$4.1 million, ensuring long-term growth beyond the initial \$3.6 million budget.
